


THE SHEEPFOLD PROJECT

The Sheepfold Wood & Prayer Garden

Lately that feels to me like a wood, with a clearing where we can make a dry stone sheepfold, a space where people can dedicate trees and plants and imagine themselves among them and when they get the opportunity actually come and visit. A type of prayer garden/wood.




The shot on the last page gives an idea of the sort of thing I am imagining.

As well as the sheepfold I am imagining a canopy that would go over it but leaving a gap for air to flow through, the next image I am sharing is how I see it but without the sides.




So the woodland prayer garden? Slash sheepfold is one part of the vision for the future.
